Adhering to our home school agreement by all parties, shows a commitment towards a shared responsibility for the child's education.

THE SCHOOL

We aim to educate each child to his/her maximum potential through the delivery of a broad and balanced curriculum regardless of race, religion, gender or disability. Every child will be encouraged and supported to care, share, believe and achieve.

We, both as individual staff and as a whole school, will:

- Provide a caring, safe and happy environment;
- Encourage our pupils to take care of others as well as their surroundings;
- Inform you of what the teachers aim to teach your child each term;
- Inform you of your child's progress at regular meetings;
- Be sensitive regarding the use of children's photographs (refer to consent form for details);
- Inform you as parents at an early stage, of any concerns we may have so that you can discuss and become involved in any matter relating to your child;
- Listen and respond quickly and sensitively to any concerns you or your child may have;
- Expect excellent attendance and punctuality;
- Encourage high standards of behaviour. Parents will be notified immediately if behaviour falls below expected levels;
- Endeavour to meet the needs of pupils and parents with disabilities;
- Inform you of events and initiatives.

GOVERNORS

Governors will:

- Visit school regularly and take a special interest in specific areas of responsibility;
- Attend relevant training;
- Provide critical friendship to the school;
- Play an active role raising standards in Llanilltud Faerdref Primary School;
- Ensure information to parents is clear and appropriate.



PARENT

As a parent I will:

- Support and help my child during his/her school life (e.g. with reading and other home learning activities);
- Encourage a positive attitude to school life and learning;;
- Support school policies and rules and encourage my child to have high standards of behaviour at all times;
- Attend meetings to discuss my child's development and progress;
- Ensure my child wears school uniform;
- Ensure my child attends school regularly and is on time, being mindful of the effect of term time holidays on continuity and consistency of education and notifying the school immediately for reasons of absence;
- Ensure the school has up to date emergency contact information at all times;
- Ensure my child is supported with homework; that it is completed and returned on time;
- Work in partnership with the school should there be a requirement to address any additional learning needs (this may include extending the partnership to working with outside agencies, such as Children's & Health Services);
- Inform the school of any concerns which might affect my child's health, work or behaviour;
- Inform the school if either myself or my child has a disability in order for the school to offer the best support possible;
- Ensure that any concerns or grievances are brought to the attention of the Headteacher through the appropriate means and not through social media such as Facebook and Twitter.
